


## A BRIEF ABOUT MID-WESTERN REGION ANTICORRUPTION COALITION

## **Overview**

Mid-western Region Anti-Corruption Coalition (MIRAC) is a coalition formed to address corruption in Uganda's mid-western region, with the aim of promoting transparency, accountability, and improved service delivery in public offices. Through advocacy, anti-corruption campaigns, and empowering communities with knowledge of their rights, MIRAC contributes to enhancing social justice and deepening democracy.

MIRAC's network spans 28 active member organizations across the districts of Hoima, Masindi, Kagadi, Kakumiro, Kibaale, Buliisa, Kiryandongo, and Kikuube.

## **Program Areas**



Democratic and good Governance. We support good governance tenets through enhancing respect for the principles of Transparency, Accountability and Participation.



Oil and Gas resources governance. We are supporting initiatives of transparency, accountability and participation in the extractives sector.



Forestry Governance. MIRAC is working on conserving central and local forest reserves through reporting illegalities in the forestry sector. MIRAC is building capacity of local businesses to benefit from oil and gas developments.



We are building awareness of local communities on different issues such as oil and gas, contracts, local government processes in delivery of services, land compensation and related issues.



MIRAC has built capacity of local community based organizations and NGOs in the areas of transparency, accountability and participation.



We are using local persons to monitor and report on services delivery at sub-county levels.



We facilitate dialogue and interface between local communities (Rights holders) and local leaders, big companies like TEPU, CNOOC on service delivery, local content (business and employment opportunities) and land compensation issues.
